# Health & Wellness Corner

**HIV/AIDS - New Hope** 



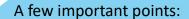
December is AIDS awareness month. HIV is a virus (*Human Immunodeficiency Virus*) that causes a disease, AIDS (*Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome*). AIDS can lead to very serious infections, cancers, heart disease and more. HIV weakens the immune system. Your immune system is your defense against infections, cancers and much more.

**The terrible news** is that HIV is a deadly virus that has killed over 42 million people around the world since its discovery in 1981, 700,000 of them Americans. The death rate has decreased greatly with modern treatment and prevention, but over 19,000 still died of AIDS in 2022 in the US and its territories.

The good news is that HIV infection can be prevented and controlled in many cases. Effective blood tests for the virus can now detect it early, though there can be a long delay between infection and the test becoming positive. Many people choose to get tested (always available at JIB Medical) and it is often done as part of routine annual checkups. While HIV is still incurable, early treatments can make the virus become undiscoverable in the body and those patients do not get sick. That was one of the great milestones in medical history.

HIV/AIDS is too complicated a subject to cover adequately in this small space, but the references above and your own doctor can help you learn more. You can get tested whenever needed and you can use new preventive methods if you believe you might be at risk. For those who test positive, modern treatments help many survive it. It can take time until the test becomes positive after exposure, so if negative at first but at higher risk, discuss if follow-up testing is needed.



- HIV is primarily transmitted by sexual contact or through contaminated blood, such as by shared needles in drug users. (See hiv.gov for other means of transmission and additional details).
- HIV/AIDS is not confined to male-male sexual contact, as was first wrongly assumed. It first entered the United States in the male gay community, but that was only happenstance. Around the world it is transmitted far more often through heterosexual contact. Anyone can contract HIV.
- It is worth noting that after years of successful reduction of all kinds of sexually transmitted diseases (STDs), syphilis and many others are on the increase again among all ages and all kinds of people (see <a href="https://www.cdc.gov/sti/index.html">https://www.cdc.gov/sti/index.html</a>).
   It is important for everyone to be aware and to be careful.
- HIV/AIDS prevention today is far more effective than at the beginning of the AIDS epidemic. Condoms provide some protection but are no guarantee. Medication is much more effective prevention (see <a href="https://www.hiv.gov/hiv-basics/overview/about-hiv-and-aids/who-is-at-risk-for-hiv#">https://www.hiv.gov/hiv-basics/overview/about-hiv-and-aids/who-is-at-risk-for-hiv#</a>).
- Testing for STDs, including HIV, is always available at JIB Medical (call 718-591-2014 for an appointment with a doctor. JIB Medical does all it can to protect your privacy. If you prefer, you do not even need to say what tests you need or why you need them until you speak privately with the doctor. You can also contact your doctor through the JIB Medical Portal). It is of course also available at outside labs.

## **Blueberry Strudel**



#### You'll Need

- 3 cups of frozen or fresh blueberries (You can also substitute for any fruit like apples or strawberries)
- ¼ cup of sugar or 2 packets of Stevia
- 2 Tablespoons of cornstarch
- Spray avocado oil
- 12 9x14 phyllo sheets, thawed if frozen

#### **Method**

- 1. In a saucepan over moderate heat, bring the blueberries, sugar and cornstarch and salt to a boil.
- 2. Lower the heat and simmer for 3-4 minutes. Stir occasionally.
- 3. Transfer to a bowl and let cool completely.
- 4. Preheat oven to 400 degrees.
- 5. Line a sheet pan with parchment paper and give a quick spray with avocado oil.
- 6. Cover the phyllo sheets with a damp towel.

- 7. Arrange a 3 phyllo sheets on a work surface with the short side nearest you. Keep the rest of the phyllo covered.
- 8. Place a heaping ¼ cup of blueberry mixture over the lower third of the phyllo, leaving a 2 inch border along the bottom and the sides.
- Fold the bottom edge of the phyllo up over the blueberry mixture and fold in the sides to enclose the filling completely.
- 10. Roll up the phyllo to form a strudel, about 4x2 inches.
- 11. Transfer, seam down, to the prepared sheet pan.
- 12. Spray each strudel with avocado oil.
- 13. Using a paring knife, cut 2 vents across the top of each strudel.
- 14. Repeat with the remaining ingredients.
- 15. Bake until golden brown and crisp, 15-20 minutes.
